CAMP AGREEMENT:

The registration fee is \$130.00 per person. This entitles the camper to room and board for the duration of camp, except for any campers taken home for disciplinary reasons.

Each camper needs to bring a Bible, small notebook, pencil, bed-sheets, pillow, blanket, towels, soap, swimsuit, changes of clothes for five days and spending money for the concession stand.

All individuals need to provide proof of insurance. In the event of an emergency medical incident, the hospital will be provided first with the counselor's personal insurance, followed by your church insurance. By signing below, you are agreeing that Sagmount Baptist Camp and MidAmerica Baptist Youth Camp are free of liability and shall be held blameless in the unfortunate event of illness or injury.

Any rules regarding behavior and dress not specified in the following camp rules may be implemented at the discretion of the Youth Camp Committee.

I acknowledge that these rules and the further rules listed in the camp booklet apply to counselors and campers alike, and I submit to the authority of the camp chairman while on campgrounds.

Camp Rules

Contractual Agreement

1. Each church must provide responsible counselor(s) for their own campers: an adult lady for the girl campers and an adult man for the boy campers.
2. All counselors are at camp to work and should be willing to accept responsibilities.
3. All counselors must read and be in agreement with the Camp Rules as listed in the camp booklet and on the Camper Registration form. By signing the front of this form, you agree to uphold and enforce the rules enacted to insure a safe, productive and spiritual camp experience.
4. Your Pastor's signature on this form represents his endorsement of your service as a counselor. By signing, he is accepting final responsibility for your actions. This form will not be accepted without your Pastor's signature.
5. If at any time on the campground, in the chow hall, in the dorms, or under the tabernacle, you see young people breaking rules, you are to correct them even if they are not from your church.

Dormitories

1. Except for loading and unloading before and after camp, male counselors are not permitted inside the girls' dormitories, nor are female counselors permitted inside the boys' dormitories.
2. Upon arriving at camp, do not move into a room unless you have talked to the camp registrar and know for sure where you are to stay.
3. Each church is required to thoroughly clean their dormitory area each day before morning services at 8:30. As a counselor, you are responsible for the cleanliness of your campers. All trash is to be picked up and trash cans dumped into the barrels. Floors should be swept, beds should be made, and all clothing, suitcases, towels, swimming suits and shoes should be arranged in an orderly fashion.
4. Churches using the community bathrooms are responsible for cleaning those bathrooms and showers.
5. Government regulations forbid the use of fire inside dormitories. This means no candles, lighters, fireworks or potential fire-causing devices.
6. When the time comes for campers to be in the dorm, the counselors must make sure that all of their group is in and have devotions with them.
7. When it is time for lights to be out, counselors should stay with their group and make sure they go to sleep.
8. While it might be necessary for you to tend to business outside of the dorms after hours, you may not do so without leaving proper adult supervision with your campers.

Dress

1. All rules of dress listed in the camp booklet and on the Camper Registration form also apply to counselors.
2. Campers and Counselors must remain in modest apparel at all times in the dorms.
3. Disrobing for showers should be done within the seclusion of the shower stall with all available curtains and doors closed to maintain privacy.
4. Counselors should make sure that the young people are obeying the dress code. They should be instructed prior to camp on proper apparel and the difference between culottes and shorts. It is hard to expect campers to wear the right clothes if they don't have them at camp.

General Instructions for Counselors

1. At the time of check-in you should turn in all forms, including registrations and all music and talent forms.
2. Every year, money disappears out of the pool dressing rooms and the dorms. Arrangements should be made for counselors to assist their campers with their money and valuables.
3. We prefer that churches sit together in the tabernacle and that counselors sit with their groups. It is permissible to reserve seats for the entire camp week.
4. During the invitation, counselors should be ready to do personal work at the altar. Please remain attentive during these times to the needs of your campers and other campers who may need assistance.
5. It is the responsibility of counselors to make sure their campers are all in services and that they are present for all events for which they have signed up.
6. It is required that all campers be at morning devotions at 7:30 by the flagpole. Counselors must make sure their group is up and at this area on time.
7. Adult counselors should observe the "two adult" rule. This requires that adults are never alone with children or youth without another adult present.
8. Adult volunteers should immediately report any behavior that seems abusive or otherwise inappropriate to their Pastor.
