CAMP AGREEMENT:

The registration fee is \$160.00 per person. This entitles the camper to room and board for the duration of camp, except for any campers taken home for disciplinary reasons.

Each camper needs to bring a Bible, small notebook, pencil, bed-sheets, pillow, blanket, towels, soap, swimsuit, changes of clothes for five days and spending money for the concession stand.

All individuals need to provide proof of insurance. In the event of an emergency medical incident, the hospital will be provided first with the camper's personal insurance, followed by your church insurance. By signing below, you are agreeing that Sagmount Baptist Camp and MidAmerica Baptist Youth Camp are free of liability and shall be held blameless in the unfortunate event of illness or injury.

Any rules regarding behavior and dress not specified in the following camp rules may be implemented at the discretion of the Youth Camp Committee.

Camp Rules

General

1. All adults are in authority and must be respected and obeyed.
2. All campers must abide by camp rules and show respect for authority or they'll be sent home at their own expense.
3. Do not throw trash on the grounds. Use trash cans.
4. No drinks or food will be allowed in the tabernacle at any time.
5. After dark, all campers must stay in lighted areas.
6. Holding hands will not be permitted at camp.
7. Unless sick, all campers must attend all devotions, lessons, morning and evening services at the tabernacle.
8. No camper will be allowed to cut in line. Campers must be in line at serving time. When the line has ended, the kitchen will be closed and no meals will be served.
9. A camper may only participate in one camp. You must be of camp age by Sept 1 of the year attending camp.
10. Bad sportsmanship on the part of any camper will not be tolerated.
11. No throwing of rocks or any other objects at any time.
12. No running or climbing hills. Stay off of the unpaved trails.
13. Skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, etc. are to be left at home.
14. No water balloons or squirt guns may be brought to camp.
15. No campers may drive an auto or other motorized vehicle while at camp.
16. Camp age children may not have cell phones or two-way radios in camp.

Dormitories

1. Campers must be inside their dorms and lights must be turned out by designated times. No one is to be outside the dorms after lights out without permission.
2. Boys are not permitted to linger around the girls dorms, and girls are not permitted to linger around the boys dorms.
3. Each church is required to sweep the floor, make up beds, carry out trash and straighten the area in which they are staying each day before morning services at 9:00.
4. Churches using the community bathrooms are responsible for cleaning those bathrooms and showers.
5. Government regulations forbid the use of fire inside dormitories. This means no candles, lighters, fireworks or potential fire-causing devices.

Dress

Girls: The acceptable wearing of apparel for girls includes culottes. Culottes are not baggy pants or shorts, but are made from a skirt pattern and should have a pleat in the front and back, and extend below the knee.

- A. No bikini swimsuits. Two-piece suits are allowed if covered by a t-shirt.
- B. No pants, gauchos or capri's.
- C. No dresses or skirts with slits above the knee.
- D. No sundresses of any kind.

Boys: Shirts must be tucked inside pants while attending classes, devotions and services.

- Campers:**
- A. Must wear shoes when outside the dormitory.
 - B. Must maintain proper dress codes & conform to camp standards for apparel on and off ball fields and in skits presented in talent competition.
 - C. Shorts are not allowed outside of the dorm rooms or swimming pool.
 - D. No tee shirts with suggestive pictures or words.
 - E. No sleeveless, mesh, or midriff tops or low-cut tops.

Swimming Pool

1. No camper is to be in the swimming area unless lifeguards are present. The pool is open from 1:30 to 4:00.
2. All campers must be fully clothed **in dry clothing** when going to and from the pool.
3. No after-hours swimming.
4. No cameras in the swimming pool area.
5. Tee shirts must be worn over swimsuits by boys and girls at all times in the pool area.
